Prerequisites: Current Virginia EMT and CPR certification as approved by the Virginia Office of EMS. EMS 121, EMS 123, EMS 125, EMS 126, EMS 127, EMS 128. Corequisite: EMS 139. Laboratory 2 hours. Total 2 hours per week. 1 credit

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The purpose of this course is to teach the student principles of care and management of patients in special populations.
