Course Prefix and Number: HIM 236 Credits: 5

Course Title: Coding and Reimbursement in Alternate Health Care Settings

Course Description: Focuses on disease and procedure coding using International Classification Disease (ICD) and Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) in alternate health care settings, such as behavioral health, home health, skilled nursing facilities, long-term care hospitals (LTCH), rehab facilities, and hospice. Prerequisite: Admittance into the Advanced Medical Coder Career Studies Certificate. Lecture 5 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: Required for the Advanced Medical Coder Career Studies Certificate, this course is designed to introduce students to the practical application of coding and reimbursement as it applies to alternate health care settings.

- f. Demonstrate correct application of ICD-10/CPT codes for home health/hospice cases, skilled nursing cases, rehabilitation facilities, and long-term care hospitals.
