Course Title: Legal Aspects of Business Organizations

Course Description: Studies fundamental principles of agency law and the formation of business organizations. Includes sole proprietorships, partnerships, corporation, limited liability companies, and other business entities. Reviews preparation of the documents necessary for the organization and operation of businesses. Lecture 3 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: To acquaint the student with the different types of business entities and how to form, dissolve, and manage each entity legally.
